





In the last few years, as identity politics has taken hold, middle-aged women have found themselves talked and written about as morally inferior beings, the face of bigotry, entitlement and selfishness, to be ignored, pitied or abused.

Hags asks the question why these women are treated with such active disdain. Victoria Smith traces the attitudes she describes back to the same anxieties about older women that drove witch hunts, and explores the very specific reasons why this type of misogyny is so powerful today. The demonisation of hags has never felt more now.





Gulchehra describes her journey and the truth about Uyghur life under Chinese rule in East Turkistan - from her early life to her success as a television star, her revelation of the realities about Communist rule, her flight to the US, and then the fight of her life: exposing Beijing's terrible crimes against her people.

About the author

Gulchehra Hoja is a Uyghur journalist based in Washington, DC and one of the world's most prominent voices fighting what the US government in January 2021 officially proclaimed the 'genocide and crimes against humanity' against the Uyghurs. Her reporting on the situation in Xinjiang for Radio Free Asia has been widely recognized in the US and Europe, and has led to honours such as the 2019 Magnitsky Human Rights Award; the Courage in Journalism Award from the International Women's Media Foundation in 2020; her recognition as one of the '500 most influential Muslims' in the world every year since 2016; and platforms at Tina Brown's Women in the World summit and the Oslo Freedom Forum.





A family history told across four generations as a young woman searches for traces of her great-uncle who disappeared during the 1930s, and through it, Ukraine's complex relationship with its Soviet past.

They say the Rooster House is the tallest building in Ukraine. Decades after the fall of the Soviet Union, little Victoria watched her great-grandmother avoid walking past its gates, with the giant red sirens – called roosters in Ukrainian – atop its walls.

As an adult, Victoria visited her grandmother in 2014, and while the Russian state annexed Crimea, she came across her great-grandfather's diary, one page scored deep with the single line: 'Brother Nikodim, vanished in the 1930s fighting for a free Ukraine.' She had never heard of this uncle, and no one could bear to tell her about him.

The Rooster House is a Ukrainian family history, embroidering its tragic and little understood past with the true colours of human experience. Profound, compassionate and threaded with unexpected joy, it is a love letter to a family and their country.

Over twenty years ago, Paul Richardson fled the conventions of British upbringing to become a peasant farmer in a rough-and-tumble village on the edge of Europe. Immersing himself in the rural culture of his remote Spanish community, he learned the traditional arts of animal husbandry and vegetable growing, wine- making and home distilling, and made bread from the rye he sowed on the stone-walled terraces of his twelve-acre farm.

In prose that shimmers with wit and sensuality, the author charts his personal route-map along a road less travelled. Along the way he pays tribute to the influences that have shaped his progress, in particular Henry David Thoreau. In Richardson's hands, off-grid living becomes both an act of rebellion and a form of personal growth. As environmental and social breakdown loom, the story of his interaction with land and nature offers heartening proof that a simpler, better life is possible. *Hidden Valley* is a glorious narrative of one man's journey towards self-reliance.

My Life as a Chameleon


