Data Migration

The project team is currently reviewing how data held in Vista can be transferred to the new distribution systems.

They are assessing which records need to be migrated and how they can be modified or 'cleansed' to work with the new processes. Cleansing activities can involve manual updates to records or automatic batch changes based on agreed rules.

Data migration is a complex task with hundreds of data types to assess, extract and transfer. An example of a recent migration decision has been on customer addresses in London, where both 'city' and 'region' fields in SAP Order to Cash will be populated to enable consistent reporting.
