## Shuttle System Handover



A key milestone was reached on 18<sup>th</sup> May when supplier TGW handed over the Stingray shuttle and conveyor systems to the Hachette UK Distribution business following successful technical testing.

The picture above shows Kris Jepson from TGW handing over to Project Director Andy Davies alongside other members of the team who have been involved in the work that has led us to this point.

While the Hachette project team is now leading further testing activities, staff from TGW will remain on site until the go-live to provide support.

## **Progress Update**

A series of showcase sessions covering publishing and finance processes were held at Carmelite House in late May. These formed part of System Integration Testing, where processes that involve interactions between systems have been tested by business users.

User Acceptance Testing focusing on detailed business testing started on 11th June and runs until early July.

A series of regression tests has been executed by the project team to confirm that the new Eden developments have not adversely impacted any current processes in SAP, Biblio and Vista. Representatives from the business will also perform tests later in June.

The project team is running a 'dress rehearsal' during June and early July. This will enact the step by step activities for the first go-live for Octopus in August to confirm the sequence and timings of events.
