In the description of Gwyon, it begins with a 'when' fronted adverbial.

**One and a half thousand years ago,**

You can use a 'when' fronted adverbial too, or maybe a 'where' fronted adverbial. Here are some examples:

when	where
In the year 2020, During the reign of Elizabeth II, Early in the 21 <sup>st</sup> century, In a time when everyone had their faces in their phones,	In a beautiful corner of Wales, In a little town called ..... , On the bottom bunk of the bed, Below the greatest landmark ever,

You can even try doubling up the fronted adverbials e.g. when + when, where + when so it reads like this:

**In the year 2020, in a time when everyone had their faces in their phones,**

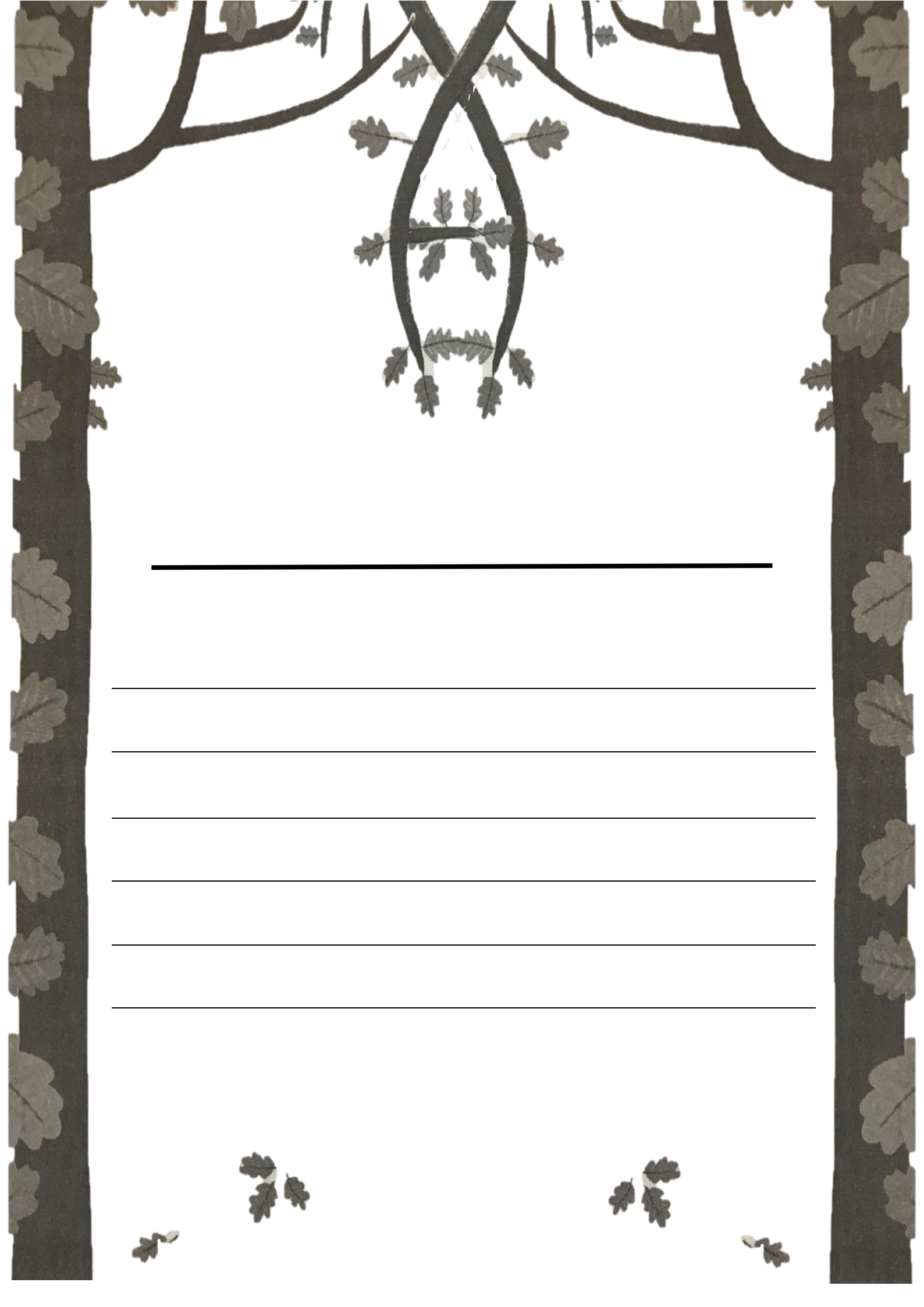
**In a beautiful corner of Wales, early in the 21<sup>st</sup> century,**

*Remember: you only need a capital letter for the first fronted adverbial and you need a comma to separate them.*

Now, continue with your best three similes. then your final sentence (or line if we make this a poem) is 'Her/His name was..... .

You can create your poem on the next sheet.

*If you wish to extend your poem, you could write a verse for each member of your family or friendship group. You could try comparing with different living things such as birds, flowers, coastal creatures and plants.*
