



BOY WHO DARES TO BE DIFFERENT	FACT	TALENT	PERSONALITY
William Kamkwamba (Born 1987)	William was born into a small village in Malawi and his family couldn't afford for him to go to school. He went to the		
	library, taught himself about electronics and set about changing the quality of life in his village with very simple tools,		
	including wind turbines, solar power and clean water.		
Percy Shelley (1792 – 1822)	Percy Shelley was lonely and bullied at school, and was thrown out of university for writing about not believing in God.		
	He ran away to Scotland and then Paris and spent his time scribbling down poems, that turned out to be the most		
	important and beautiful ever written in English.		
Jaime Escalante (1930 – 2010)	Jamie started teaching at a school with a reputation for being dangerous and violent, where pupils often failed		
	exams. He didn't listen to people telling him it was a waste of time. He taught his students in ways they had never		
	experienced before, and eventually more of them got into the local university than any other local school combined.		
Boyan Slat (Born 1994)	When 16-year-old Boyan realised how polluted the earth's oceans were with plastic rubbish, he invented a new		
	type of ocean cleaner which scientists doubted. His invention worked amazingly week, and earned him the title 'Champion of the Earth'
