

- Outcomes: A list of modes of transport used by Monsieur Roscoe; a postcard describing his holiday!

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


#### **<u>1: PACKING FOR A HOLIDAY TO FRANCE</u>**

FRENCH VOCAB: Which is your favourite new French word on these pages? What is the French word for "the seaside"? What is the French for "Come and play"?

ACTIVITY: Summarise Monsieur Roscoe's time at the seaside by drawing what he does in each of the Storyboard squares below. Write any important French words or phrases in the Vocabulary Boxes below each square or section of the story!







## <u>3: FRENCH FOOD</u>

Use pages 25–26 in the book, or appendix 3 in these resources

How many ice creams do Monsieur Roscoe and Dougal order? What does Fry order? How would you describe the café where Monsieur Roscoe, Dougal and Fry are eating?

FRENCH VOCAB: Which is your favourite new French word on these pages? What is the French word for "ice cream"? What is the French for "I would like an ice cream please"?

ACTIVITY: Play French Food and Drink Snap

Create snap cards by drawing pictures of the following items on pieces of paper: bread, water, coffee, burger, juice, ice cream, olives, bananas, cheese, French fries, salad, cake

You'll need two versions of each card

How to play the game:

You win a point every time you are the first see a matching pair of cards and shout out, "SNAP". Remember, you must *then* say the correct word for the food or drink pictured – in French! Keep practising until you are super-quick and your French skills are perfect!





#### 4: TRAVELLING HOME

Use pages 27–28 in the book, or appendix 4 in these resources

What is it like to come home after a nice holiday? How do you think Monsieur Roscoe feels to come home? How do you know? Where is Monsieur Roscoe's home?

FRENCH VOCAB: Which is your favourite new French word on these pages? What is the French word for "goodbye"? What is the French for "See you soon"?

ACTIVITY: What are the different modes of transport that Monsieur Roscoe took on his journey? Can you think of any more modes of transport? Draw at least five and write down the name of each mode of transport in French!

When you have finished, complete a postcard from Monsieur Roscoe describing his holiday. Use the template in appendix 5. Include information on the following things:

Where Monsieur Roscoe has been What he has seen What he has done What he has eaten Which modes of transport he has taken Monsieur Roscoe's favourite thing about the holiday!
