His debut epic fantasy novel, *Schatten über Ulldart* (*Shadows over Ulldart*) was the first of many of his books to win the Deutscher Phantastik Preis (Germany's premier literary award for fantasy) in 2003. Since then he has frequently topped the bestseller charts, and his Number One bestselling Dwarves and Aelfar series have earned him a place among Germany's most successful fantasy authors. Derek Miller was born in Boston, Massachusetts and grew up in New England. He did his Master's in National Security at Washington DC's Georgetown University, then studied at The Hebrew University in Israel and St Catherine's, Oxford before completing his Ph.D. in International Relations at the Graduate Institute in Geneva. Before becoming a full-time novelist, he worked all over the world for a variety of organisations, including the United Nations. His first novel, *Norwegian by Night*, won the CWA John Creasey Dagger and was an *Economist* best novel of the year; subsequent crime novels *The Girl in Green* and *American by Day* were both shortlisted for the CWA Gold Dagger.
