
The Confessions of Samuel Pepys

Edited by Guy de la Bédoyère

The celebrated seventeenth-century diarist and civilian naval official Samuel Pepys (1633–1703) has always been notorious for his infidelities and treatment of his wife Elizabeth. But all previous editions of his shorthand diary, kept from 1660–9, have in different ways sought to suppress the truth and detail of his conduct. Now brand-new transcriptions made by Guy de la Bédoyère of the controversial passages, the first for half a century, along with new discoveries among genealogical records throw new light on the truth about Pepys. Pepys used a mixture of shorthand English and a bizarre Franco–Latino polyglot to recount the most salacious details. These have been transcribed, translated, and analyzed in full by the editor for the first time, opening a window on new aspects of Pepys's private life and providing a compelling insight into the mind of a seventeenth-century man of professional status who lived and worked in London during tumultuous times.

Guy de la Bédoyère has written extensively on the ancient world over the last thirty years, most recently *Gladius: Living, Fighting and Dying in the Roman Army* (which was described by the *Sunday Times* as 'highly enjoyable'), *Pharaohs of the Sun* and *Populus*. He has also edited the correspondence between Pepys and fellow seventeenth-century diairist John Evelyn.

Chasing the Dark

Ben Machell

The story of Britain's most famous paranormal investigator - and a journey into the unexplained.

Late one evening the telephone rings, and on the line is a stranger. They tell you that your nine-yearold son gave them your number. Your heart stops. You tell them that your son has been dead for almost twenty years. They know this, they say. He wants you to come and see him.

What do you do when reality begins to fray around you? Where do you go when science cannot explain your experiences? The Society for Psychical Research was founded in 1882 to tackle these very questions and to shine light on the shadowy world of the supernatural. Distinguished members have included prime ministers and Nobel Prize-winning scientists.

But the most prolific of all the SPR's paranormal investigators was a young British naval officer named Tony Cornell. A rationalist and a sceptic he became haunted by a wartime encounter in India that changed everything . Between 1950 and 2010 he became perhaps the world's most prolific investigator of psychic phenomena and paranormal events. Alongside his colleague, the psychologist Alan Gauld, they combined the roles of detectives, exorcists and psychiatrists, returning time and again to the unsettling spaces that exist on the very periphery of our tidy, rational lives: Ghosts. Poltergeists. Psychic powers.

Drawing on a previously untapped archive of Cornell's case files, which survive as a unique repository of encounters reported by ordinary people, Chasing the Dark is the compelling story of our relationship with the supernatural. What do these atmospheric and often chilling cases teach us about who we are, and the anxieties that consume us? And why do the dead still find ways to make themselves known?

Ben Machell has worked for *The Times* since 2005, and is a principal feature writer, interviewer, and columnist for the award-winning *Times Magazine*. His debut book, *The Unusual Suspect*, was widely acclaimed and shortlisted for the Golden Dagger at the 2022 Crime Writers' Association Awards. The drama rights to *The Unusual Suspect* have been acquired by Pathé UK, who are to produce the story into a major TV series.

The Colour of Injustice


The story of racial injustice in the UK - told through 10 compelling cases.

Like *The Secret Barrister*, *The Colour of Injustice* is a passionate call to reflect upon and re-examine Britain's relationship with justice. Lee Lawrence will tell the most compelling and outrageous stories of crimes against Black people in Britain and in doing so ask profound questions about contemporary British society.

Lee Lawrence was just eleven when his mother, Cherry Groce, was shot by police during a raid on the family's south London home. It was an event that would spark a violent uprising and dominate his life for the next thirty years as he fought for justice and for the police to admit their wrongdoing. Along the way, Lee came across dozens of other cases, past and present, which made it clear that the racial prejudice and bias which resulted in his mother's shooting had been in place for many decades, impacting the lives of thousands of innocent people along the way.

Through a deeply researched and fast-moving narrative, Lee Lawrence seamlessly combines historical fact with his dramatic first-hand experiences of racial injustice to present vivid stories – from the Somali sailor who was wrongly convicted of murder in Cardiff in 1952 to the assault on professional footballer Dalian Atkinson, and from the hounding of Notting Hill's Mangrove Club to Black Lives Matter – that chronicle how Britain's Black community has been mistreated. Though there remains much work to be done, Lee Lawrence is also an inspiring guide who highlights the many positive changes that have taken place and outlines those still needing to be enacted. Against the backdrop of the hard-learned lessons of years gone by, *The Colour of Injustice* also lays the foundation for a pathway to the future to move towards a truly anti-racist society.

Lee Lawrence is a social entrepreneur who works to help marginalised people find their voice, manage conflict and achieve justice. In 2014, he founded Mobility Enterprises with the hope of aiding those who would otherwise struggle in their daily life by providing public transport for the disabled. In 2016, he founded the Cherry Groce Foundation which exists to enhance the wellbeing of individuals with a physical or mental impairment. Lawrence is the author of *The Louder I Will Sing*, winner of the 2020 Costa Biography Award. He regularly lectures to the Metropolitan Police.

The Power and the Glory: The Definitive Story of the World Cup Jonathan Wilson


The definitive history of the World Cup, for the first time exploring the tournament's socio-political impact across the globe as well as the goals and scandals that keep us all gripped.

The football World Cup is the most watched sporting event on the planet. It has become a global obsession: 211 nations initially entered the 2022 edition. It has been running for almost a century.

The modern World Cup grew from chaotic beginnings nearly a century ago. It is a cultural phenomenon that draws the world together like nothing else, and that gives it a profound importance. Ask a random person on a random street to name a moment in the history of Senegal and they may well say Pape Bouba Diop's winner against France in the 2002 World Cup, a goal not only against the defending champions but against the former colonial masters.

The World Cup has political significance. Yet there is no comprehensive history of the tournament: based on fresh interviews and meticulously research this book will change that. West Germany's success in 1954 was a moment of reintegration into global society. Progress to the semi-finals in 1998 gave a huge boost to Croatia's sense of national self. But football is an unpredictable sport. There has never been a comprehensive history of the World Cup that has considered not only the matches and goals, the players and coaches, the tales of scandal and genius, the haggling and skulduggery of the bidding process, but has also placed the tournaments within a socio-political framework. The story of the World Cup is also the story of the world; this book tells its definitive history.

Jonathan Wilson is the editor of the Blizzard and a freelance writer for the Guardian, World Soccer and Sports Illustrated. He is the author of twelve books, including Inverting the Pyramid: The History of Football Tactics, Behind the Curtain: Football in Eastern Europe, Angels with Dirty Faces: The Footballing History of Argentina, The Barcelona Legacy, The Names Heard Long Ago and Two Brothers.

Darwin considered humans one part of the web of life, not the apex of a natural hierarchy. Yet today many maintain that we are the most intelligent, virtuous, successful species that ever lived. This flawed thinking persuades us to exploit the earth at the expense of other species, throwing us into a perilous planetary imbalance.

In *The Arrogant Ape*, Christine Webb draws on years of research into the rich social, emotional, and cognitive lives of our closest living relatives to show that human exceptionalism is an ideology that relies more on culture, delusion and faith than on evidence. She exposes the ways that many scientific studies are biased against other species and reveals underappreciated wonders of nonhuman life – from the language of songbirds and prairie dogs, to the cultures of chimpanzees and reef fishes, to the acumen of plants and fungi. With compelling stories and fresh research, *The Arrogant Ape* gives us a paradigm-shifting way of looking at other organisms – and ourselves – that is essential if we are to heal and rejuvenate our shared planet.

Christine Webb, PhD, is a broadly trained primatologist at Harvard's Department of Human Evolutionary Biology, with expertise in social behavior, cognition, and emotion. She works with nonhuman primates in diverse settings and collaborates with scholars from the social sciences and humanities to reimagine the role of science in the growing charge to grant moral status to other animals. Her work has been covered by popular outlets including *The New York Times*, the *Washington Post, National Geographic*, and the BBC.




Avery is a grad student in New York working on a collection of cultural reports and flailing financially and emotionally. She dates older men for money, and others for the oblivion their egos offer. In an act of desperation, Avery takes a job at a right-wing dating app. The "white-paper" she is tasked to write for the startup eventually merges with her dissertation, resulting in a metafictional text that reveals itself over the course of the novel.

Meanwhile, her best friend, Frances, an effortlessly chic emerging filmmaker from a wealthy Southern family, drops out of grad school, gets married, and somehow still manages to finish her first feature documentary. Frances's triumphant return to New York as the toast of the art world sends Avery into a final tailspin, pushing her to make a series of devastating decisions.

In this generational portrait, attention spans are at an all-time low and dopamine tolerance is at an all-time high. Flat Earth is a story of coming of age in America, a novel about commodification, conspiracy theories, mimetic desire, and the difficulties of female friendship that's as sharp and sardonic as it is heartbreaking.


The late French actress Maria Schneider is perhaps best known for playing Jeanne in the provocative film *Last Tango in Paris*, directed by Bernardo Bertolucci and released to international shock and acclaim in 1972. The experience would haunt her for the rest of her life, traumatising her and sparking a tabloid firestorm that only ceased when she began to retreat from the public eye nearly two decades later.

To Maria's much younger cousin, Vanessa Schneider, Maria was a towering figure of another kind – a beautiful and fearsome fixture in Vanessa's childhood, a rising star turned pariah. Here, Vanessa recounts the challenges of their overlapping youths and fraught adulthood and reveals both the tragedy and inevitability of Maria's path in a society rife with misogyny.

My Cousin Maria Schneider is the story of a talented artist and the cousin who admired her, and of exploitation and how its lingering effects can reverberate through a lifetime.

Vanessa Schneider is a French journalist and novelist. She lives in Paris, where she works at the prestigious daily newspaper *Le Monde*. For over ten years, she has written award-winning essays and novels that have been translated abroad. *My Cousin Maria Schneider* is her eighth book, and her first to be translated into English.




Call me Mark. My first time in the Roman district of Trastevere was in 1997 whilst covering the England World Cup qualifier for Radio 1. Nearly thirty years later, I'm headed back there, with my wife Bella and dog Arlo in tow.

Call me Arlo. I normally hate the sight of suitcases in case it means Him and Her are leaving me, but this time I'm coming with them. I've got my favourite food packed and my doggy passport ready to go.

In March 2024, the radio presenter Mark Radcliffe and his wife Bella set off from Cheshire in their VW Beetle convertible for a three-month sojourn in Rome taking with them their beloved and pampered five-year old cavapoo, Arlo. Et Tu Cavapoo? is an account of their time there, told alternately between Mark and Arlo. Join them as they take in the sights (and sniffs) of Rome; from Arlo being taunted by his mortal enemies at the city's cat colony, the pros and cons of queueing for pizza at a trattoria, Arlo's fear of water extending to the Trevi Fountain, discovering what exactly the Spanish had to do with those famous steps, and the site where Shakespeare's Caesar uttered the immortal words: 'Et tu, Brute'?

Told with humour, affection and insight, this a travel book like no other as one man and his dog seek to understand each other in one of the great cities of the world. A must-read for lovers of travel and history, food and drink, art and architecture, but also those seeking a deep insight into the eccentricities of the canine mind.

Mark Radcliffe is an English radio broadcaster, musician and writer. He is best known for his broadcasting work for the BBC, for which he has worked in various roles since the 1980s. One half of Radio 1's semi-legendary Mark and Lard, he hosted the Radio 1 Breakfast Show, after which he presented the afternoon programme for almost seven years. For Radio 2, Mark presents The Folk Show and on 6 Music he co-hosts the weekend show Radcliffe and Maconie. In recent years he has presented The Richest Songs in the World and The Story of Indie on BBC4 and regularly hosts BBC2's Glastonbury coverage. In 2020 Mark released his fifth book, Crossroads: In Search of the Moments that Changed Music.

The Bookseller of Hay

James Hanning


A biography of the bookseller and entrepreneur Richard Booth, the 'King of Hay', known for his contribution to the success of Hay-on-Wye and its annual literary festival.

In 1962, a young man left university without a degree and, for want of anything better to do, bought a small shop in an obscure market town on the edge of the Brecon Beacons. Within 15 years, largely through force of personality, Richard Booth had created the world's largest second-hand bookshop, attracting thousands of visitors from across the globe to Hay-on-Wye, on the Welsh border.

The Bookseller of Hay tells the tale of an extraordinary, chaotic man, a true British eccentric, who invented the term 'book town', attracted a coterie of exotic and illustrious followers, crowned himself king, declared the town's independence and provided the bookish backdrop which allowed a rival attraction, the now world-famous Hay Festival, to flourish.

It is a story of the extraordinary singlemindedness of a hard-working, hard-playing and rebellious son of privilege, inspired by a romantic vision and a deep love of the area, of a man better suited to publicity than bean-counting who launched countless careers but whose business instincts undermined precisely what had brought success. Booth was a deeply divisive figure, but love him or hate him, all agree on one thing. He put Hay on the map. James Hanning, a frequent visitor to Hay since the 1960s, has interviewed dozens of local people and booksellers and with typical acuity wonderfully captures this bygone era of eccentricity and excess.

James Hanning is a former deputy editor of the *Independent on Sunday*. His first book, co-authored with Francis Elliott of *The Times*, was a biography of David Cameron, which ran to three editions and is widely regarded as the definitive book on Cameron. Building on a longstanding interest in the phone-hacking scandal, in 2014 his book *The News Machine*, written with exclusive access to the *News of the World*'s chief investigator Glenn Mulcaire, lifted the lid on the unlawful climate at that newspaper in the early 2000s. One admirer described it as reading 'like a thriller'.


Opening in East London, *Migraine* follows two men, one young and the other on the other side of middle age, as they cross the weather-ravaged city pursuing a doomed love.

The snow has melted, but the thaw reveals a world transformed. London is in ruins, its population a fraction of its pre-freeze level. The weather has become wildly unpredictable – huge pressure swings leading to powerful localised storms. And this has led to an epidemic of migraine. When a storm hits, the pain comes, along with a wide range of visual and haptic hallucinations named migraine 'aura'.

The novel starts with Ellis, one of a very small proportion of the population who don't suffer from weather-induced migraines, being struck by a migraine attack for the first time. After being blinded by hallucinations, he wakes in a ruined bookshop with its former owner, Sam, who pulled him to safety from the storm. No longer excluded from the migraine epidemic, Ellis decides to find his exgirlfriend, Luna, and win her back. With Sam tagging along, he sets out from the bookshop and heads south.

From here, chapters alternate, giving the backstory of Ellis and Luna's relationship, from their first meeting to their final rupture, while in the present day the two men wend a crooked psychogeography through the centre of the city. *Migraine* is concerned with questions such as: what does a society look like if it's organised around chronic pain? What kind of culture would this set of conditions produce?

Samuel Fisher is a writer, bookseller and publisher. His debut novel, *The Chameleon* (Salt, 2018) was longlisted for the Desmond Elliot Prize, shortlisted for the Collyer Bristow Prize and won a Betty Trask in 2019. He co-owns Burley Fisher Books in Hackney and is a director of Peninsula Press. His second novel, *Wivenhoe*, was published on Corsair last year.



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And Notre Dame is Burning

Miriam Robinson


This blistering debut novel tells the story of a woman whose marriage starts to fall apart in the wake of a miscarriage and her husband's serial infidelity. It's a gripping depiction of what happens when truth and time begin to unravel; and one woman's attempt to write herself back to safety.

I find myself wondering what would have happened if I had been more clear. If our relationship had not begun with this one tiny untruth.

Time has flattened for Esther. Her storybook marriage begins, and ends, in the shadow of Notre Dame cathedral. Sifting through the ashes of their years together, a time now collapsed by grief, she finds a mismatched litany: mountain lions, a Paris bookshop, bad dancing, bad faith, marshland, prairieland, miscarriage, motherhood, bagels, Eve.

In order to understand this new story, she seeks help – from generations of women, from a book about evolution, from a friendly philosopher/scientist with a solid grasp of the space-time continuum. Mostly, though, Esther writes – fragments, notes, letters – tracing a fine line between a story that soothes and one that suffocates; confronting the impossibility of communicating anything in the right way, at the right moment, to her daughter. This extraordinary debut is an excavation of betrayal, of motherhood, of time and timelessness, of guilt and consequence, of love coming to an end. Told with dry wit and a startling ferocity, *And Notre Dame is Burning* heralds an urgent new voice in literary fiction.

Miriam Robinson is a creative consultant for the publishing industry and beyond, and the host of the podcast My Unlived Life. She holds an MA in Creative Writing from Goldsmiths, University of London and her short fiction has been shortlisted for a Pushcart Prize, the inaugural Pindrop/RA Short Story Prize and the Pat Kavanagh Prize. She has also been a Bookseller Rising Star, and has won the Kim Scott Walwyn Award for young women in publishing. Originally from Colorado, Miriam lives in East London with her daughter and their six-toed cat Astrid.

What Hunger



This is not a tale where the girl is running away from danger - instead, she is the danger.

It's the summer before high school and Ronny Nguyen is too young for work and too old for cartoons. Instead, she spends her days falling asleep to trashy magazines on a plastic lawn chair in her small backyard. She's a stark contrast to her older brother Tommy, her immigrant parents' pride and joy. Ronny can't bear to think about what it will be like when Tommy, with whom she's always been close, goes to college and leaves her alone with Me and Ba in their quiet house.

Their parents never speak of their childhoods or families in Vietnam, except in the context of food: thick spring rolls with slim and salty nem nuong; bright-yellow rice noodles called mi quang, steaming bowls of pho tai with thin, delicate slices of blood-red beef floating on top. In the aftermath of the war, Me and Ba explained, meat became dangerous. Ronny and Tommy must never take their lives – or their food – for granted. Well, Ronny never had much of an appetite for meat, and life on the wrong side of the highway in a white suburb has never been easy. But then tragedy strikes, and everything Ronny thought she knew about herself or her life changes in an instant. A few nights later at her first high-school party, a boy does not take no for answer and suddenly Ronny is overtaken by a force, an urge, larger than herself. As Ronny comes into her own power, she discovers a new taste for life that is poised to save her, even as it threatens to destroy everything and everyone around her.



Peter thinks Gary only wants to get close to his mom because she works at Scientific Atlanta, a lab with big government contracts. But who is going to believe him? He's just a kid into BMX and MTV.

But after another woman who works at the lab is killed, Peter recruits an unlikely pair of allies - a hasbeen pulp writer named Dennis Hotchner and his drag performer buddy and heavy, Jackie Demure. Both soon become the target of an unhinged Russian hitman (is it Gary? Maybe!) with a serious Phil Collins obsession.

Meanwhile, Sylvia Weaver, a young, Black FBI agent, investigates Scientific Atlanta in the wake of the employee's murder and discovers a nest of Russian spies. Little does she know her investigation is being thwarted by a seriously compromised colleague in Washington, D.C., who is in league with a lovesick, hypochondriac KGB defector who is playing both sides of the Cold War to his benefit.

As Ronald Reagan and Soviet Premier Mikhail Gorbachev prepare for a historic nuclear summit in Geneva, what happens in Atlanta might change the course of the Cold War, the 20th Century, and Peter Bennett's freshman year of high school.

Ace Atkins is an award-winning, New York Times bestselling author who started his writing career as a crime beat reporter in Florida. Everybody Wants to Rule the World is his thirty-first novel. His previous novels include eleven books in the Quinn Colson series, multiple true-crime novels based on infamous crooks and killers, and 2024's Don't Let the Devil Ride. In 2010, he was chosen by Robert B. Parker's family to continue the iconic Spenser series, adding ten novels to the franchise. He lives in Oxford, Mississippi with his family.


Paper Crown

Sculling

Sophie Dumont

A highly personal debut collection, these poems talk about grief and environmental damage as the author reflects on her relationship to bodies of water and her time kayaking on the River Avon.


Sophie Dumont's debut collection of poems, *Sculling*, circles the curses that unravel from an Avonbased canoe club, where she trained to be a canoe coach aged sixteen. Dumont's own coach and partner of three years died suddenly in an aquaplaning road accident, which led to his heart and five other organs being donated. *Sculling* explores how this bereavement has caused Dumont to reflect on her relationship to bodies of water, from her own body to the state of pollution in UK rivers. She uses the kayak as a vessel to traverse life's accumulation of losses. Amongst great grief, poems soar with humour and a searing openness when talking of sexual health, dementia and being an aunt. With vulnerability and obsessive observation, *Sculling* speaks of the dull mirrors of a wet city and the narrator's need to 'understand the rain's inclination to its gutters'.

Sophie Dumont is a Bristol-based poet and copywriter for two charities. She trained to be a canoe and kayak coach in Bristol and the Brecon Beacons, and was accredited on her sixteenth birthday, making her briefly the youngest coach in the UK. Sophie's work has been published widely and has been broadcasted on BBC Radio Bristol. In 2019, Sophie won Bristol's Hammer & Tongue Poetry Slam. Sophie's poetry has been shortlisted for the Fish Poetry Prize 2021, the SaveAs Writers' International Writing Competition 2021, and twice for the Bridport Prize. In 2018, she was appointed poet-in-residence on Bristol Harbour by Boat Poets and toured her work in Bristol's Arnolfini, Plymouth's Barbican and London's Southbank Centre. From 2015–2020, Sophie was writer-in-residence and voice artist for Riptide, an immersive theatre company in Leeds. She wrote three productions, including an app-based experience using GPS satellite navigation, consisting of a 360-degree binaural sound walk along the river Aire. In 2021, Sophie was awarded a place on the Genesis Jewish Book Week Emerging Writers' Programme, on which she was mentored by George Szirtes. In summer 2022, she was awarded writer-in-residence at Exeter Custom House by Literature Works. Sophie co-runs Satellite of Love – a monthly poetry night aboard a lightship in Bristol's harbour.

Set in 1960s Maine, a witty, twisty murder mystery following a young woman who just wishes something interesting would happen for once... who stumbles across a crime of passion.


'What are the chances of receiving a love letter, engagement ring, and phone call for a stranger, only to see her murdered the next day?'

And (strangely) everyone has a boat. But who is willing to kiss and tell? As the body count rises and the danger nears, why does Billie feel like she's more than just a side character? And after yearning to be in the action for so long, would it be terribly unladylike to have some fun of her own?

A love letter to uncivilised behaviour, *Etiquette for Lovers and Killers* blends mystery and romance into a witty, twisty, murderous delight that aches for better manners.

Anna Fitzgerald Healy's writing has been featured in Dark Matter Magazine, Mystery Tribune, the Hoxie Gorge Review, and several anthologies by Brigid's Gate Press. She grew up on the Maine coast and now works in LA, living in a (possibly haunted) miniature castle in the Hollywood Hills. She's already well underway with the second book in this series.



Oliver Twist & Me: The True Story of my Family and Charles Dickens's best-loved novel

A dual biography of Charles Dickens and orphan boy Robert Blincoe.

We all think we know the tale. As a child, Charles Dickens was forced to work in a blacking factory in terrible conditions, an event that scarred him for life and inspired his great novel about a vulnerable child, *Oliver Twist*. Except that only tells one part of the story.

Dickens actually lifted significant parts of the narrative from one of the earliest working-class memoirs by genuine factory boy Robert Blincoe. In *Oliver Twist & Me*, Robert Blincoe's great-grandson, the novelist Nicholas Blincoe, presents a dual biography of the early years of Robert and Dickens, including reflections on his own quasi-Dickensian upbringing in Rochdale. He retraces the steps of his ancestor, whose life story was scarred by tragedy and redeemed by hope, as well as traipses the streets of Camden in search of the real workhouse that inspired the novel.

Both an affectionate reassessment of a beloved classic and a trenchant investigation into what it takes for working-class voices to be heard on their own terms, *Oliver Twist & Me* will show you Dickens as you've never seen him before.

Nicholas Blincoe is the author of six novels, winning the CWA Silver Dagger for his crime novel, Manchester Slingback. His non-fiction books include include a deeply personal history of Bethlehem – his home for a decade – which won praise from figures as diverse as President Jimmy Carter and historian Peter Frankopan, with starred reviews in the New York Review of Books.

The Good Russian: In Search of a Nation's Soul

Jana Bakunina

A dual Russian–British citizen returns to her home town of Ekaterinburg in 2022 to ask why so many of her fellow Russians support Putin, and delves into her own family history of persecution by Stalin.

When Vladimir Putin invaded Ukraine in February 2022, the writer Jana Bakunina, who has lived in the UK for twenty years, felt furious, ashamed, but most of all helpless. A year later she travelled to her home city of Yekaterinburg to see how ordinary Russians viewed the conflict – and whether the soul of her nation had truly been crushed.

Jana finds a booming city seemingly untouched by war. Reconnecting with old friends, she discovers people either happy to go along with a regime that has brought them stability, or else staying out of politics. Most painful of all, her once liberal father has channelled his personal disappointments into becoming a firm fan of Putin.

In the grand humane tradition of Russian dissident writers, Jana Bakunina grapples with a universal problem: what happens when a country you love becomes infected by nationalism? What hope is there when voices of conscience are silenced by dictatorship? And can Russians in exile still imagine a liberated future?

Jana Bakunina came to Britain in 1999 to study at Oxford University and, after a career in finance, she has written on Russia for multiple publications including the *Financial Times*, *New Statesman*, the *Standard*, *Sifted* and the *Spectator*. Her fiction was shortlisted in the 2022 Bridport Prize; she was a finalist for the 2022 London Independent Short Story Prize, and in 2023 came second in the Olga Sinclair Prize.


The Little Book of Positive Birth Stories Claire Fulton

The idea of giving birth can be daunting – if not outright terrifying. So many of the stories we hear about birth are negative or frightening, but in fact many women and birthing people feel positive and satisfied after their birth, however their births have unfolded. What's more, reading positive birth stories during pregnancy can help women to feel calm, confident and prepared, and so increase the chances that they'll have an experience they'll look back on positively.

Collected here by doula and hypnobirthing coach Claire Fulton are thirty true stories from a diverse group of ordinary people, representing a wide array of experiences. 

Her final novel, *Rotations and Revolutions*, was awarded both the Shimasei Literature Prize and the Chūō Kōron Prize in 2021, and her journals, offering an intimate portrait of dealing with depression and then with pancreatic cancer, also became hugely popular. Yamamoto passed away in 2021 in Karuizawa, Nagano.





Muriel Spark, D.B.E, C. Litt, was born in Edinburgh in 1918. A poet and novelist, she also wrote children's books, radio plays, a comedy, *Doctors of Philosophy*, first performed in London in 1962, and biographies. She is best known for her stories and many successful novels, including *Memento Mori*, *The Prime of Miss Jean Brodie*, *Loitering With Intent, The Comforters, A Far Cry from Kensington* and *The Public Image*. For her long career of literary achievement, Muriel Spark won international praise and many awards, including the David Cohen British Literature Award, the T. S. Eliot Award, the Saltire Prize, the Boccaccio Prize for European Literature, the Gold Pen Award and the Italia Prize for dramatic radio. Muriel Spark was given an honorary doctorate of Letters from a number of universities, London, Edinburgh and Oxford among these. She died in 2006.

Dan Gunn is a novelist, critic, and translator, as well as being one of the editors of the four-volume Letters of Samuel Beckett and editor of the Cahiers Series. He is Distinguished Professor of Comparative Literature & English at the American University of Paris where he directs the Center for Writers & Translators. He was designated in 2017 as editor of Muriel Spark's letters.







Mary Renault (1905–1983) was born in London and educated at St Hughs, Oxford. She trained as a nurse at Oxford's Radcliffe Infirmary, where she met her lifelong partner, Julie Mullard. Her first novel, *Purposes of Love*, was published in 1937. In 1948, after *The North Face* won an MGM prize worth \$150,000, she and Mullard emigrated to South Africa. There, Renault was able to write forthrightly about homosexual relationships for the first time – in her masterpiece, *The Charioteer* (1953), and then in her first historical novel, *The Last of the Wine* (1956). Renault's vivid novels set in the ancient world brought her worldwide fame. In 2010 *Fire From Heaven* was shortlisted for the Lost Booker of 1970.



An incisive, culturally observant analysis of the evolving mores, manners and taboos of social justice orthodoxy, which has profoundly influenced how we think about diversity and freedom of expression, often with complex or paradoxical consequences.

Summer of Our Discontent is the story of the dramatic and not inevitable turn in consciousness, encapsulated in the generation-defining twin calamities of the death of George Floyd and Covid-19. These events reshaped not just American life, but also the networked, internet-driven monoculture that huge swaths of the planet increasingly cohabit. Any attempt to make sense of the recent past is not without risk. The aim here is not so much a definitive account of an era more or less beginning in the second Obama administration and concluding in the fall of 2023, after Hamas's attack on Israel, but a broader analysis of the evolving manners, mores, taboos and consequences of the recent American social-justice orthodoxy – 'antiracism', or 'wokeness' more broadly – that came in from the discursive margins and went global.

This book is ultimately an argument for why we must resist the mutually assured destruction of identitarianism – even when it comes dressed up in the seductive guise of 'antiracism' – and really believe in the process of liberalism again, if we are ever to make our multiethnic societies hospitable to ourselves and to the future generations we hope will surpass us. We must, in a sense, reopen – or finally open – the liberal mind, which has been pressed perilously close by furious, radical, and sophistic forces on both sides of the political and cultural spectrum.

Thomas Chatterton Williams is a staff writer at the Atlantic, a visiting professor of humanities at Bard College, and a nonresident fellow at the American Enterprise Institute. He is the bestselling author of Self-Portrait in Black and White and Losing My Cool. Williams is a visiting professor of the humanities and a senior fellow at the Hannah Arendt Center at Bard College, a 2022 Guggenheim fellow, and a visiting fellow at the American Enterprise Institute. 



Between 1695 and 1715, there were ten general elections, and political partisanship gripped Britain to an extent never known before and seldom, if ever, since.
