



Run your own Animal All-Stars authorless event



Event Ideas:

Not sure how to organise your event? Here are some fun ideas for you to consider:

- Read a chapter from the book to set the scene. We would suggest reading the Opening Ceremony chapter and the first event, which are pages 6 13 and pages 30 33. To make it more engaging for the kids why not start with a vote on which animal will win the race?
- A fun craft activity would be to create your own medals using card, ribbon and foil. They could be for sporty things or just for being brilliant in the event
- Play one of the Animal All-Stars themed games outlined on the next page
- Encourage the children to draw their own sporty animal based on a reading from the book
- Hand out the activity sheets at the end of this pack for the kids to complete during the event or to take home
- Hide the animal cards around the shop and get the children to find the four sporty animals. Then sit down and discuss which animal they think would win in different sporting events
- Use the blank animal cards to get children to create their own sporty animal cards. They can then play each other with them to see who would win in a sporting event
- Call out the facts on the Fact from Fiction sheet and get children to guess which is true





Animal All-Stars Themed Games

Musical Statues

A fun twist on this classic game is to ask the children to move like different animals until the music stops - they could leap like a tiger, hop like a rabbit, slither like a snake or scuttle like a crab.

Memory Game

A variation on the 'Packed My Suitcase' game. Ask the children to stand in a circle. The supervisor then says "On day one of the Animal All-Stars games the animals prepared to compete in the big swim. There was Orlando the orca whale.". The supervisor then asks the child next to them to repeat the sentence, this time adding another animal. The next child in the circle must repeat the sentence again, including the previous animals, before adding another. Continue until the whole room has added an event to the games.

Chinese whispers

A variation on the 'Chinese Whispers' game. Sit all the children in a circle and pick one to start the All-Stars Whisper. They will whisper an animal and an event to the child next to them until it has gone all the way around the circle. When it has reached the last child they must say out loud what they heard.

Pictionary

Set up a white board or pad of paper and a hat full of different animals on slips of paper. Get the children to take turns drawing the animals and guessing together.

Charades

The classic acting game but make all the charades either animals or sports.

Sports

A fun starting activity to get rid of some of the children's excess energy. Start the event by running on the spot, doing star jumps and any other fun sporting warm up you can think of.




