
On September 24, 2021, Rachel Eliza Griffiths married her husband, the novelist Salman Rushdie. On the same day, her closest friend, Kamilah Aisha Moon, died suddenly. With sharp analysis and vivid storytelling, The Next Fix shows that what looks like a cure is often another dose of the same poison.


